# Mercer Emerging Markets Shares Fund<sup>1</sup> Mercer Investment Funds

#### Quarter ending 31 March 2023

## What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Mercer Emerging Markets Shares Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Mercer (N.Z.) Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

## **Description of this fund**

The fund invests in shares listed on share markets in emerging economies. The portfolio is managed using a single manager. Environmental, Social and Governance characteristics are integrated into the underlying investment managers' investment processes. The fund aims to provide a Gross Return<sup>2</sup> above the MSCI Emerging Market ex Tobacco Index with net dividends reinvested on a rolling three to five-year basis.

## What are the risks of investing? Risk indicator for the Mercer Emerging Markets Shares Fund<sup>3</sup>:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.



#### **Annual Return Graph<sup>5</sup>**

This shows the return after fund charges and tax for each of the last 10 years ending 31 March. The last bar shows the average annual return for the last 10 years, up to 31 March 2023.

### What fees are investors charged?

Investors in the Mercer Emerging Markets Shares Fund are charged fund charges. In the year to 31 March 2022 these were:

\* The performance fees paid or rebated vary from year to year depending on the outperformance of the underlying funds in which the fund invests. The Fees in the current PDS are based on investment managers' average positive outperformance over the last five years. However, the performance fees in this fund update are based on actual fees paid (or rebated) for the year to 31 March 2022. See the product disclosure statements that applied for the year ending 31 March 2022 for more information about the basis on which performance fees were charged.

#### Example of how this applies to an investor <sup>7</sup>

Ben had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Ben incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of -\$533.00 (that is -5.33% of his initial \$10,000). Ben also paid \$0.00 in other charges. This gives Ben a total loss after tax of -\$533.00 for the year.




#### Actual investment mix

#### **Notes**

1. On 3rd March 2023, Mercer (N.Z.) Ltd became the manager of the fund. The previous manager was Macquarie Asset Management Public Investments (NZ) Limited. From 3rd March 2023, the Macquarie Emerging Markets Shares Fund is called the Mercer Emerging Markets Shares Fund.

2. Gross Return is the return before the deduction of tax, expenses and fees and assumes all income is reinvested.

3. In previous quarters, the risk indicator has been calculated based on the weekly returns of the Fund. The basis of the risk indicator has changed to the monthly returns to be consistent with other investment options managed by Mercer (N.Z.) Ltd.

4. These returns are for the periods ending 31 March 2023.

5. The bar graph shows fund returns after the deduction of fees and tax, however, the market index returns are shown before any fees or tax are deducted.

6. GST is currently charged at 15% on 10% of the management fee in accordance with the non- binding IRD agreement with the Financial Services Council of New Zealand Incorporated on behalf of the funds management industry. GST on management fees is currently under review and therefore this percentage may change in the future.

7. The returns and tax calculations used in this example are the actual fund returns and tax charges (or rebates) for the year ended 31 March 2023. Net of tax returns can be more than gross of tax returns where, due to the fund's tax position, it receives a tax rebate rather than paying tax.
